## TELEVISION PERSONALITY-TURNED-AUTHOR RELEASES "SUPER SHOPPER" BOOK SET

For recommendations on almost every topic known to man, think: Robyn Spizman. A native Atlantan and longtime resident of Sandy Springs, this television personality-turned-author proclaims, "I'm an idea fanatic! I wake up every day thinking of new ways to solve lifes little problems."

Once an art instructor in a Dunwoody school, Robyn attracted the attention of a publisher interested in committing her ideas to paper. That initial success evolved into a 15-year run on Channel 11's "Noonday News," where Robyn enthusiastically shared her how-to and craft ideas with viewers from 1982 to 1997.

Today, Robyn describes herself as a mom, a consumer advocate, a bargain shopper and a businesswoman. "All my ideas and proposals come from real life," she said. Whether it involves parenting or shopping for a good buy, Robyn draws upon the rich source of material the everyday provides. "And I've been lucky to have children and a husband who lovingly support my ventures, not to mention supplementing my ideas with their own creative suggestions. Children always offer a fresh perspective on a subject!"

In addition to her extensive television career, which includes appearances on CNN, The Discovery Channel's "Home Matters," CNBC's "What's Hot" and Channel 11's "Peachtree Morning with Tom Clark and Carmen Burns," Robyn has penned a total of 63 books. Her projects include a well-known 1996 book co-written with H. Jackson Brown, Jr., titled A Hero In Every Heart" and a 1997 undertaking, "When Words Matter Most," for which she received wonderfully positive feedback. She has also successfully coauthored four parenting books with her friends Stephen and Marianne Garber. Two of the more acclaimed titles are "Beyond Ritalin" and "Good Behavior."

On a daily basis, this seemingly tireless businesswoman co-manages a public

Robyn's most recent project is a sixvolume set titled "Super Shopper." Meals in Minutes · Presents quick and tasty recipes organized by category from appetizers like salmon roulade wrapup to desserts comprised entirely of fresh fruits; and

Quick Tips for Busy People - Shares suggestions for taming the telephone and gives readers time-saving tips for kids, gardeners, travelers, wedding planners, home buyers and those who love to entertain.

Considering her upcoming schedule, Robyn's time management tips must be worth their weight in gold. Impending projects include an immediate trip to New York for to promote her books in 22 cities by satellite, in addition to the release of a new book this fall. Titled "The Perfect Present – The Ultimate Gift-Buying Guide for Every Occasion," the work proposes to remove all anxiety from the reader's gift-giving process.

Whom does Robyn credit for all her success? "I attribute my achievements to my parents and their constant message that anyone can do anything," Robyn says. "That's the way I've tried to live my life and it's the same message I repeat to my children today."
